DESCRIPTION OF THE PROGRAM

The National RN Case Manager Certificate Program is designed to prepare Registered Nurses for new and emerging case manager, care manager, and advanced care coordination roles needed across the healthcare system. Nurses in these roles focus on improving the health of chronically ill people and populations at risk for poor health outcomes while assuring high quality care and lower costs. Content in this Program bridges health policy and evidence with RN Case Manager professional role development and emphasizes patient-centered application in clinical practice.

SUMMARY OF PRACTICE OUTCOMES

Registered Nurses who successfully complete this Program will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate essential knowledge needed to perform emerging roles in case management, care management and care coordination across healthcare settings.
- 2. Utilize evidence based strategies consistent with national initiatives designed to ensure patient centered care delivery, address social determinants of health, and support health equity.
- 3. Use new knowledge to implement RN Case Manager and Advanced Care Coordination role development into practice.
- 4. Meet CE eligibility requirements for specialty credentialing through ANCC, the American Nurses Credentialing Center, and for recertification with ANCC and CCMC, the Commission for Case Manager Certification.

ABOUT THIS LEARNING FORMAT

This faculty guided online learning option is designed to be competed independently following the course sequencing and faculty prompts embedded in the recorded lectures. Learning is accomplished by completing lectures and learning activities posted to the online classroom. Our Pay As You Go option allows participants who wish to break apart their tuition to enroll and pay for one section of the Program at a time. Participants have 30 days from the date of enrollment to complete the section. All 4 sections need to be completed within 1 year of starting the Program.

SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION

Completion of the program's lectures, learning activities and course evaluation demonstrates successful completion of the **National RN Case Manager Certificate Program** and is required for 32 continuing education (CE) hours to be awarded.

Different from a workshop or conference, a certificate program is a well-established nursing education strategy used when practicing nurses need to acquire specialized knowledge quickly and efficiently to better care for patients. In this program of study, participants demonstrate mastery of a specific body of knowledge over a specified period of time. Upon successful completion of the program, a Certificate of Completion is awarded, demonstrating this knowledge, and building on your nursing degree.

This continuing nursing professional development activity was approved by the Wisconsin Nurses Association, an accredited approver by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation (ANCC). WNA CEAP Approval Number: WICEAP-0265.

Nursing contact hours must be completed by JULY 1, 2024. No certificates will be issued after this date.

Whenever possible we try to provide a pdf document that can be easily downloaded. Sometimes we much rely on a weblink which occasionally is not working or does not open. If this happens, please let us know so we can respond but also use your own skills by accessing an internet search engine using the title provided to see if you can locate the resource more immediately by yourself.
